It is with great sadness and a hint of joie de vie that we note the passing of Martin Pitt.

"Marty" as he was known to players and supporters was an irrepressible rugby enthusiast who played a key role in the rejuvenation of the Sydney University Football Club in the late 1990's. His rapport with players was legendary and he gave selflessly of his time and inexhaustible energy to inspire the Colts players to lay the platform for the Club's renaissance.

Marty had a long association with the Cranbrook school as pupil (Prefect and Head of Davidson House), Old Cranbrookian, geography teacher, rugby coach to 1st XV level for both School and CAS, manager of Australian Schoolboys Rugby touring teams, Social Service mentor, explorer, wordsmith, Housemaster of both Chelmsford and Woodward, Senior Master, Deputy Headmaster, Acting Headmaster, first Director of the Foundation, Honorary Secretary of the OCA, Director of Alumni and Braidwood farmer.

On top of his thirty five years working at Cranbrook and several years (1969 to 1975) teaching at The Armidale School and Shore, Martin made major contributions to the wider community, as Sub Warden, Acting Warden and Council Member at St Paul's College, Sydney University, as Board Member of the Boys and Girls Brigade, as Church Warden and Synods man for the Anglican Parish of Braidwood, as the initiator and driving force behind fundraising activities enabling young country people to afford living in Sydney so that they could undertake university studies, and much else besides. Where he saw a need he acted. And he carried every player with him.

There will be a celebration of Martin's life in due course, in memory of an exceptional and much loved educator, exemplar, mentor and friend. We will let you know when the venue and date are fixed, and plans are in place.

Dearly loved husband of Robin, devoted father of Lucinda and Angus and adored grandfather of Piers. Brother of Robert. Martin died suddenly on 8th October in Panama City.
